

MWMC Vision Programme – Update 1

The MWMC Vision Programme is a series of initiatives to develop the work and witness of the Church and to make our buildings fit for purpose in the modern world.

Although the strategy will be set and all decisions made by the Church Council, it's really important that everyone knows what's happening and feels comfortable expressing their views and contributing to the plans. With this in mind, we're going to publish a monthly update in The Link starting with this one.

The Vision Programme is divided into 5 separate workstreams and the majority of work at the moment is gathering information to enable the Church Council to set direction and make both strategic and financial decisions when it meets in October.

Workstream 1 – Waingroves Property Development

Workstream 1 concerns our building at Waingroves. The church community there have met to determine emerging and future needs that aren't met by the current set up and ways to alleviate pressure as the building is used so much. This includes –

devotional space for when the worship area is in use in the week and on Saturdays; increased storage to release areas for other use; enhancements to the worship area (particularly the acoustics) improvements to the lighting and security arrangements outside.

The site survey for Waingroves has taken place and a meeting is being held at Waingroves Methodist Church with Green 2k Design Architects on Thursday 12th December at 11.15 am. This meeting will inform the Architect in order for them to draw some concept designs which they hope to have to us before Christmas.

Acoustic Consultancy ADT have taken measurements and have provided a document that outlines several options regarding acoustic panels which will be fitted to the walls and ceiling. In the coming months this document needs to be shared and a decision made as to which option is best.

Workstream 2 – Marehay Property Development

Workstream 2 concerns our building at Marehay. The church community there have met to determine action to make the building fully accessible and fit for purpose in the 21st century in order that usage may be increased exponentially as we move forward as a joint church. This includes –

retaining the pulpit and organ as a focal point; establishing a single level between and within the worship area and the school room; replacing the pews and partition wall providing direct level access from outside direct into the worship area and school room.

The site survey for Marehay has taken place and a meeting is being held at Marehay Methodist Church with Green 2k Design Architects on Thursday 12th December at 10 am. This meeting will inform the Architect in order for them to draw some concept designs which they hope to have to us before Christmas.

Workstream 3 – Net Zero

Workstream 3 concerns the target to make MWMC Net Zero by 2030. It is envisaged that environmental features for heating, insulation, water capture and energy generation and storage will be included into both Workstreams 1 and 2 once initial requirements have been confirmed.

A meeting has been held with Phillip Stainer and it is currently being decided if he has capacity in his new role as property manager for the Circuit to support us in the development of this workstream.

Workstream 4 – Community & Outreach Worker

Workstream 4 concerns the requirement to employ more human resources to scope then drive forward the mission and outreach of MWMC. Initial thoughts are this work will contain two major strands –

Getting alongside, enhancing and future proofing existing work Determining current and future needs of the community not currently being met by MWMC (in both in the existing settlements and new housing developments) and commencing work in these areas.

A draft job description is in progress. An approach has been made to Clive Teale both to provide early notification that documents for review and approval will be coming his way and to ask for similar specimen job descriptions he has for similar roles. There is a need to liaise with circuit to determine whether this would be a circuit or MWMC post and with Gill Stamp to understand budgetary considerations.

Workstream 5 – Sanctuary Project

Workstream 5 challenges MWMC to look beyond our traditional work and geographical boundaries to consider how our premises, funds and other spare resources could be used to benefit the most vulnerable people in society. This workstream is very much at the 'ideas' stage at the moment and, in order to assist our thoughts, Sarah is undertaking two strands of research

One, to determine what needs exist within Derbyshire, what agencies exist, what they do and potential for MWMC to support or for them to support MWMC. Two, to determine what other Methodist Churches are doing within the safe and sanctuary 'space' and what could be realistic for us to replicate in our setting

It's vital we know our thoughts, ideas and concerns on any part of the Vision Programme – especially at the moment as no firm decisions have been made so there's scope to change everything. If you do have any feedback, please see or send this to Sarah who will ensure it's shared with the whole MWMC community. Thank you.

This research is still being undertaken.

Peace Light from Bethlehem

Service

Date: Wednesday 18th December

Time: 18:00

Location: Trinity at Mansfield Woodhouse.



- We are seeking a representative from each circuit/church to come and attend this service to receive the Peace Light
- They will then carry the 'Peace Light' to cascade to the church(es)

Carrying the Peace Light away.

We recommend a Lantern with a new Tea Light candle as this should easily burn for about 3-4 hours. (I always carry a spare Tea Light just in case - but never needed it so far). It needs a passenger to carry the lantern once the light has been transferred

Alternatively, a Sanctuary 7-8 day candle can be used - but again, it needs to be carried by a passenger, plus it can be easily blown out by the wind. Some people do use a Miner's Lantern. We will not light anything that we may consider unsafe.

People need to consider how they will keep the flame safe and prolonged. Once the flame has extinguished, it cannot be relit unless lit from another kindled Peace Light Flame. Lighting from another source invalidates it being The Peace Light.
