<u>CANON KAREN WILL BE LEAVING US IN THE AUTUMN</u> - The **Revd Canon Karen Hutchinson**, Vicar of The Bourne and Tilford is to become Archdeacon of Norwich, it was announced this week.

Karen has been Vicar of The Bourne and Tilford since 2012, before which she was Vicar of Crondall and Ewshot. She is Diocesan Adviser in Women's Ministry, and was elected to General Synod in 2013.

Karen will be collated and installed as Archdeacon of Norwich and also Warden of Readers at 3.30pm on Sunday 13 November in Norwich Cathedral.

Karen said: "I will be sad to leave the people in my current benefice and in the Diocese of Guildford, but am very much looking forward to working with new colleagues and parishes in Norwich and taking forward the renewed mission strategy."

Bishop Andrew said: "Karen has contributed hugely to the life of the diocese over the past ten years, both through the excellence of her parish work, as a member of General Synod and in her wider contribution, notably as Adviser on Women's Ministry. Her warmth, wisdom, spiritual depth and unflappability will be greatly missed, and I have no doubt that she will make an outstanding Archdeacon of Norwich".

The Rt Revd Graham James, Bishop of Norwich, said: "Karen has a rich experience of parish and diocesan ministry, as well as her legal training and practice, to bring to the role. She has won the hearts of the people of her present benefice by her strategic leadership and pastoral imagination. I am confident she will soon come to love this diocese and its people and be greatly appreciated for the gifts she will bring."
